



LED Waves Certified as a New York State Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business

New York City -based lighting manufacturer LED Waves is pleased to announce that they are now officially recognized as a Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business (SDVOB) with the State of New York. The accreditation comes from the state's Division of Service Disabled Veteran Owned Business Development (DSDVBD).

The DSDVBD was established by the Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business Act signed into law by Governor Andrew M. Cuomo in 2014. This law serves to honor the sacrifices of service-disabled veterans by promoting their businesses through public procurement opportunities. A list of SDVOBs is available through the New York State Office of General Services.

LED Waves' certification with the DSDVBD positions their LED lights in front of agencies obligated to meet procurement minimums of goods and services provided by SDVOBs. With the growing priority of energy efficiency in public policy, this alignment is beneficial to both the company and to the state.

The SDVOB status also qualifies LED Waves purchases for select rebates and credits. The company carries a wide range of indoor/outdoor LED lights that are vetted and pre-qualified for such incentives – both statewide and across the USA – by the DesignLights Consortium.
