If they can't build new plants and EE cuts energy use, how do they increase their profits? Aggressive EE programs in New England result in ISO New England's canceling transmission upgrades EIA forecasts essentially zero load growth for electricity through 2025 Can utilities manage a dispersed information infrastructure, <i>aka</i> the Smart Grid? Impact of significant utility infrastructure upgrades on ratepayers termed too rich by utility CEOs and therefore not feasible Will Superstorm Sandy and other recent natural disasters boost the use of CHP and microgrids? What do these changes mean going forward for utility customers? How do these changes affect the existing ESCO delivery model?
